

For the first time this year, the American Angus Association measured and weighed all the show cattle at the National Western. Weight, frame score, backfat thickness and scrotal circumference were provided to the judges as well as to the spectators.







Whitestone Farm of Aidle, Virginia, led out the reserve senior bull calf champion in the Angus sale bull show. Their entry is Whitestone Stalone.


