hybrid corn varieties and disease resistant alfalfa varieties that will work for eastern farmers.

"While mid-western varieties may work in the east, our goal is to help our customers here grow corn. We got here because of the customer," said John Weideman, area sales manager. "And it will be the customer that will takes us on from here. We are always open for

suggestions from our farm customers."

also a partner in the family firm, with four young sons and the potential for yet another generation of Godfrey "brothers" interested in meats retailing.

By 1973, the firm had outgrown its original farm butcher shop and moved into the present processing and retail sales facility on the Old Susquehanna Trail, just north of Loganville. The Godfrey's route trucks were discontinued in the late 1970s. Five years ago, a stand at Eastern Market was opened.

Godfrey Brothers has always relied primarily on local sources for their livestock supply, providing a market annually for thousands of locally-produced beef

and pork.

Long-time supporters of York County 4-H and FFA programs, the Godfreys are regular buyers at the various youth livestock project sales held each year. Meats judging and identification teams are also supported, with use of the Godfrey's facilities and expertise for practice and contest activities.

CENTURY FARMS
Eight York County farms were
honored as Century Farms, recognized by the state for continuous
family ownership for at least one
hundred years. Century Farm honorees included Alton and Ida
Krebs and William and Nova
Krebs, both with farms located at
Glen Rock, and the Airville farm
of Randall Cross Stewart.

Five of the Century Farms are in the Spring Grove area. They are owned by the James Martin family, V. Louise Lightner Mummert, Robert and Lucreta Rebert, Philip and Shirley Stambaugh, and Norman and Delphine Waltersdorff.

Speaker for the awards dinner was Congressman Steve Gunderson (R-Wis.), ranking Republican on the Livestock, Dairy and Poultry Subcommittee of the House Agricultural Committee.

Congressman Gunderson cited changing markets and changing policy as the two key challenges facing agriculture in the 1990s. Markets will increasingly shift from domestic to international. The 1990 Farm Bill, he notes, must give negotiators for the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) the tools to assure that American farmers will be fairly treated in the Uraguay round of trade talks.

Management and technology, says Congressman Gunderson, will allow U.S. farmers to outproduce those of any other nation. The use of biolotechnology can help solve the problems of feeding an estimated 1.5 billion increase in the world's population over the next decade, as well as pressing environmental issues.

According to the Wisconsin Congressman, the 1990 Farm Bill must be market oriented and provide a "level playing field" for U.S. farmers to compete in world markets. It will be written, he predicts, on the floors of Congress, not by agriculture representatives but by urban representatives addressing the issues of environment, food safety and animal rights.
