LOW TOXIN CROPS DESERATELY NEEDED THE DEMAND IS FAR EXCEEDING THE SUPPLY

WHITE SOYBEANS AT \$12 PER BU., for making soy milk and soy foods. With our fertilizer yield is about the same as ordinary yellow beans.

YELLOW SOYBEANS AT \$8.00 PER BU. for making the same as above and also for livestock feeding. Yield is about 70 to 83 bu. per acre with our seed and fertilizer.

like mine (Ezek. 36:26) would make you love your neighbor, rather than destroying God's soil (Rev. 11:18) as it says in the original.
