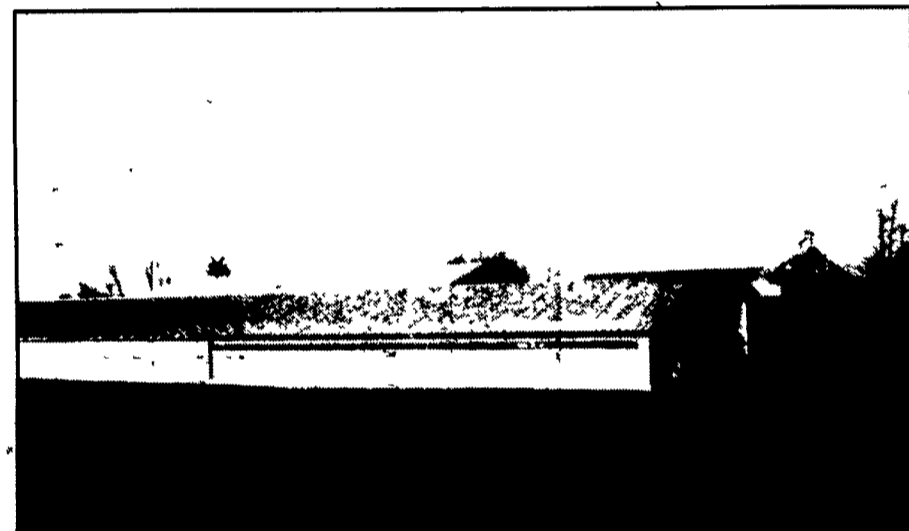
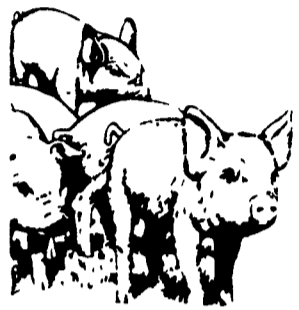
cides for the 1990s, and Dr. Donald Ganske of DuPont Chemical Company will talk about trends in pesticide usage over the next decade.

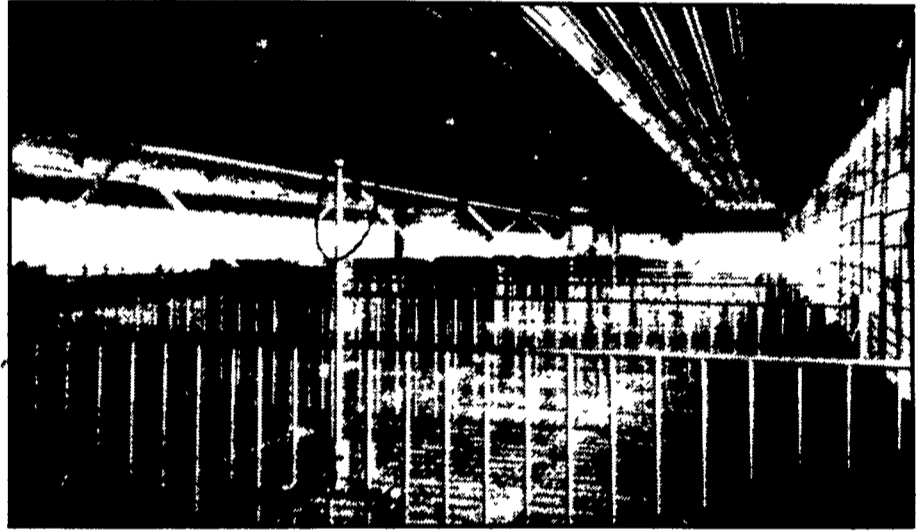
