Wayne County Dairy Day Set

HONESDALE (Wayne Co.) — The 1990 Wayne County Dairy Day will be held March 8, from 9:30 a.m. to 3:15 p.m. at the Wayne County Veterans Memorial Armory, according to co-chairmen Victor Latourette and Charles Dennis.

Dairy Day is held each year to provide dairy farmers with new technology and to recognize the importance of the dairy industry to our local economy. It is sponsored jointly by Penn State Extension and area farm businesses and organizations.

The program will feature Dr. Robert Yonkers, extension professor of milk marketing, Penn State University. In the morning he will discuss the milk marketing outlook for Pennsylvania. In the afternoon he will present information on emerging dairy marketing and policy decisions, which will include such topics as BST, the 1990 farm bill, and milk production quotas.

Other subjects to be presented at Dairy Day will include an update on the farmland easement purchase program in Wayne County, rodent control on the

dairy farm, conservation demonstration practices and a presentation by a dairy princess representative.

It is expected that about 39 commercial exhibits will be on display at Dairy Day. Milk, ice cream, and cheese bars will be provided by Dairy Lea, Welsh Farms, and Eastern Milk Producers respectively.

U.S. Savings Bonds will be provided by the following banks: Farmers and Merchants Bank, Honesdale National Bank, The Dime Bank, First National Bank of Lake Ariel and the Wayne County Bank.

An additional registered Holstein calf, as a door prize, will be donated by John Wetmore. Lunch will feature steamship round of beef with milk provided by Farmland Dairies. There will also be live radio coverage by WDNH/WVCC radio.
