MARKETS IN REVIEW; FEB. 22-28, 1990. FEEDER STEERS AND HEIFERS VIRGINIA WERE STEADY EXCEPT WEAKNESS NOTED ON WEIGHTS OVER 700 LBS. MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO \$3.00 LOWER WITH FULL DECLINE IN WEIGHTS OVER 600 LBS.

SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIF-ERS IN VIRGINIA NOT FULLY TESTED AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE \$1.00-2.00 LOWER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE STEADY TO \$1.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE 50 CENT TO \$1.00 LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS 4% BELOW A WEEK AGO AND 7% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 2 POUND LIGHTER THAN A YEAR AGO.
