OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY COMPARED WITH LAST WEEK: FEEDER CATTLE AND CALVES STEADY TO \$1.00 HIGHER. STEER DEMAND GOOD. HEIFER DEMAND CLOSED MODERATE. MAJORITY OF FEEDERS WERE ON THE THIN SIDE MONDAY; AVERAGE TO MODERATELY FLESHY CATTLE DOMINATED TUESDAY'S RUN. WEIGH-UPS GAUNT TO AVERAGE DUE TO RAIN. WHEAT FIELDS ARE MUDDY. CATTLE WEIGHTS OFF WHEAT FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, AT THE OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS, ARE LIGHTER THAN SAME PERIOD A YEAR AGO. OVER 500 LB. STEERS AVERAGED 727 LB. LAST MONTH VERSUS 758 LB. FEBRUARY LAST YEAR. THIS IS A 31 LB. AVERAGE WEIGHT DIFFERENCE. THE FEBRUARY 1990 AVERAGE MARKET PRICE FOR 500 LB. UP STEERS WAS \$1.77 PER HUNDRED WEIGHT LESS THAN FEBRUARY 1989. JANUARY WEIGHT COMPARISON SHOWED ONLY A 13 LB. DECLINE. CUTTER AND BONING UTILITY SLAUGHTER COWS FULLY STEADY, BREAKERS \$1.00 LOWER.
