Supplies were fully adequate and slow to clear. Less than trucklot asking prices were steady at 58-66 cents. Live supplies were adequate, with average weights generally desirable. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. The trade sentiment was cautiously steady. In the parts complex, supplies of cutlets were adequate, whole breasts were irregular but at least adequate, dark meat items were in close balance to instances short of current needs, and wings were fully adequate to ample.

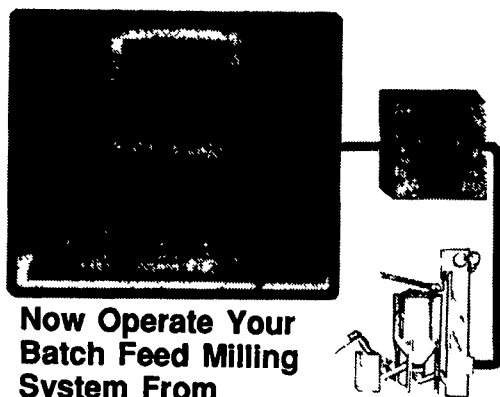
