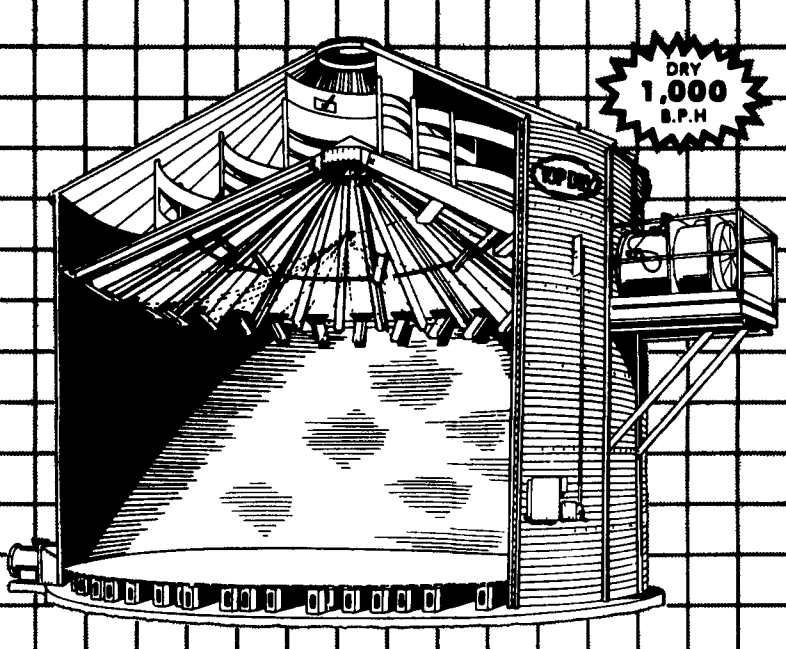

1. PREPARATION - High volume water blasting at 1,000 lb. pressure re-surfaces barn siding into a smooth (like new) appearance!
 - a. Performed by professionals quickly at reasonable cost
 - b. By yourself with your own or rented equipment
 - c. Or other more conventional methods
2. APPLICATION - To insure better adherence to this super prepared surface, use the best fine bristle brush in four directions to evenly distribute the recommended mil thickness of seal coat coverage
3. SPECIALIZATION - Every barn is different but generally it's best to use a high quality mildew resistant product, specially formulated to meet the requirements of this partially weathered wood that was and will be weather stressed.
4. WARNING - The modified oil latex is less effective as a wood preserver and actually increases nail & metal deterioration. Deal with home people. At their rates, I could double mine.
