Dairy Promotion Program Carries \$760,000 Into '90

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Total funds available to the Pennsylvania Dairy Promotion Program (PDPP) ran ahead of projections by more than \$320,000 or 13 percent, according to their 1989 annual report.

The PDPP, under the auspices of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, provides "market, promotion, research, and nutrition education programs that maintain and expand domestic and foreign markets for fluid milk and dairy productions," according to the company's mission statement.

PDPP management expenses finished 18 percent below

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1988-1989 budget. Combining increased funds and decreased expenses left PDPP with an unused contingency fund of more than \$310.000. PDPP will carry about \$760,000 into 1990.

Local funding programs are one area to benefit from the surplus, according to the report. In the past year, PDPP's contributions to the programs increased 38 percent, and the organization plans to "be even more active in soliciting local applications for funds in 1989-1990."

More than \$1.21 million

From Allentown to Erie, Pennsylvania, PDPP spent more than \$1.21 million to reach the target demographic segment of adults 18 to 54 years old.

Included in the advertising was season-long buy on the Penn State Football Radio Network to promote fluid milk. Spots ran on more than 60 stations statewide. Sponsorship with Capital Radio Network was also included.

Holiday media schedules included commercials asking, 'What would Holidays be like without real dairy products?"

The company also formed cooperative ventures to increase market penetration. According to the report, the most important partnership the PDPP formed during 1988-1989 was the cooperative marketing agreement between the PDPP and two allied Pennsylvania "The result was the Joint Progdairy promotion programs.

New partnership

A new partnership with the American Dairy Association (ADA), the Dairy Council (DC), and the Mid-East UDIA allowed PDPP to "pool" their advertising funds and make a joint media but of more than \$545,000 to promote holiday products, according to the report.

"In early 1989 we entered negotiations with the ADA/DC and the Mid-East UDIA, with the objective of pooling and coordinating the marketing dollars spent in Pennsylvania," wrote Paul Corbin, PDPP chairman, in the report.

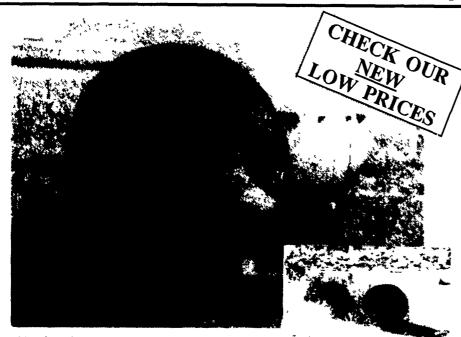
ram Development and Promotional Assessment Funds Allocation Agreement.'

The agreement took effect on July 1 and we saw immediate benefits in the form of an October-to-December media buy," Corbin wrote. "Our message not only reached more potential consumers than ever before, but we also realized substantial savings for Pennsylvania's dairymen.

Before 1989-90 is finished, the report indicated, the partnership will have spent "some \$2.1 million" to advertise dairy products.
