DHIA Services To Continue

In Greensboro, delegates were also briefed on future tests that will be made available with ELI-SA technology — the basis of the ProStaph test.

"With this kind of technology in our DHIA labs, we are setting outselfs up to offer a complete battery of tests to DHIA members," said Phil Dukas, director of operations for DHIA Services. "Some of these future possibilities could include diagnostic tests for Strep. mastitis, Jone's, and milk residues.'

DHIA Services is also involved with other services and programs besides the ProStaph mastitis test. They include: Fearing eartags, the DHIA credit card, and director and officer liability insurance.
