SLAUGHTER STEERS AND HEIF-ERS IN VIRGINIA WERE \$1.00-2.00 HIGHER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE UNEVEN 25 CENT LOWER TO \$1.00 HIGHER.

COWS AND BULLS IN VIRGINIA WERE MOSTLY 50 CENT TO \$7.00 LOWER AS MIDWEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO 50 CENT LOWER. BEEF PRODUCTION WAS LESS THAN 1% BELOW A WEEK AGO BUT 5% ABOVE A YEAR AGO. AVERAGE DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 13 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN A YEAR

VEAL AND CALF PRICES IN VIRGI-

NIA WERE \$1.00-3.00 LOWER AS MID-WEST PRICES WERE STEADY TO WEAK. VEAL AND CALF PRODUC-TION WAS 2% ABOVE A WEEK AGO BUT 17% BELOW A YEAR AGO. AVERAGED DRESSED WEIGHTS WERE 8 POUNDS LIGHTER THAN A YEÁR AGO.
