Trucklot buying interest was mixed and irregular. Seller offerings were generally adequate for prompt delivery; however, buyers found supplies tight and more difficult to book for later as several processors looked to curtail operations for the upcoming religious holiday. Inquiry for skinned boneless breasts was light to fair and supplies were fully adequate; spot trading was noted into next week at \$1.90. Whole breasts were adequate to fully adequate and in heaviest balance on yellow; several buyers noted reduced further processing schedules Friday as providing little incentive to purchase extra product. Leg quarters tightened to a good demand for retail activity which reduced the availability on legs. Wings continued to clear well and ranged adequate to short.

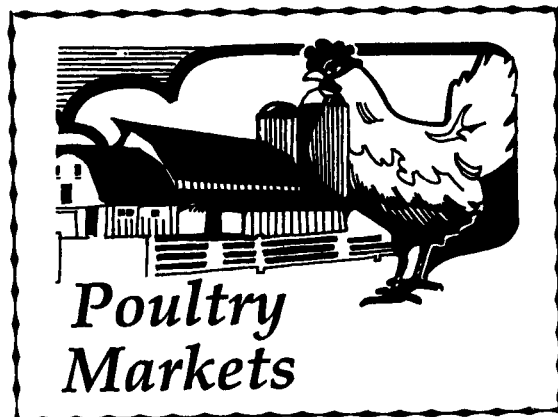

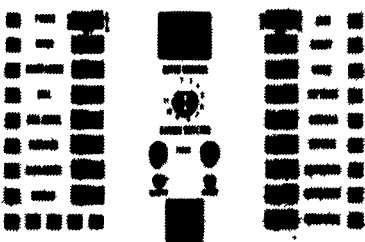

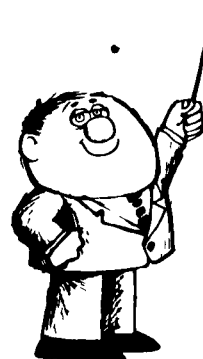
