ICI Fibres in Greensboro, North Carolina, is underwriting the production of T-shirts with the national Earth Day logo on the front and ICI Fibres logo on the back. The shirts will be given to local high school students who make the most outstanding contributions on Earth Day.

ICI's Dighton, Massachusetts, site is going all-out for Earth Day, including the completion of phase two of its Total Quality Commitment Site Landscaping Porject; a poster contest for an elementary school with winners receiving environmental books; and distribution of dogwood seedlings to employees and 750 students in the local elementary school, among other activities.

Employees at Glidden's headquarters in Cleveland, Ohio, will receive helpful hints on recycling on Earth Day. Employees are currently separating aluminum beverage cans and donating the cans to children's services.

In addition to all of these activities, ICI employees across the U.S. will be actively participating in Earth Day activities in their respective communities.

Every resident of Adams Coun-


ty is encouraged to spend at least one hour participating in this project that ultimately benefits everyone in our society. This event will focus attention on litter and the throw-away aspect of our society.

PennDOT and/or townships will designate locations where full trash bags may be deposited on state-maintained roads or township locations in Adams County. Information on these locations can be obtained when trash bags and vests are picked up.
