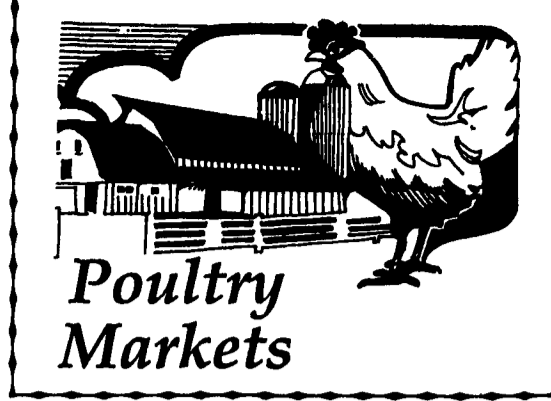
### New York Eggs

### Delmarva Broiler Fryer

April 18, 1990

Movement of ready-to-cook whole fryers was light. Supplies of 2 1/2 pound sizes were short of immediate needs, but heavier sizes were fully adequate and being offered at competitive prices. Less than trucklot asking prices were steady at 55-64 cents. Live supplies were adequate. Average live weights ranged desirable to heavy. Today's processing schedules were moderately heavy. The trade sentiment was unsettled but barely steady at best. In the parts complex, supplies of cutlets and wings were in close balance to instances short of needs, legs were adequate, and whole breasts and leg quarters were fully adequate to ample and slow to clear even with lower asking prices.

The market tone remained steady to weak in instances. Movement of cartoned eggs tapered from early week as pipelines were filled. Demand for loose product was generally fair. Supplies of nest runs and graded product were usually in a good balanced position following the good holiday clearances. Breakers were cautious as inquiry for finished product improved.

Trucklot buying interest was light and unaggressive except for wings, which were short of some traders needs. Supplies of skinned boneless breasts were generally well balanced at unchanged prices. Whole breasts were fully adequate to ample and excess supplies were traded at lower price levels. Legs were fully adequate. Leg quarters were fully adequate to ample despite fairly heavy retail ad activity and inquiry for later deliveries. Thighs and drums were adequate with thighs in the closer balance with trade needs.

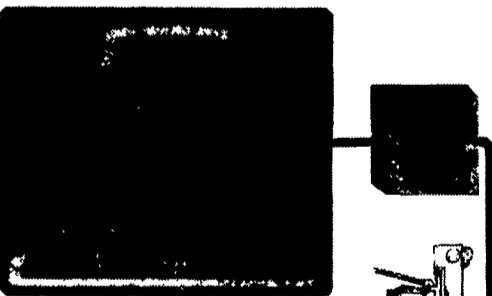

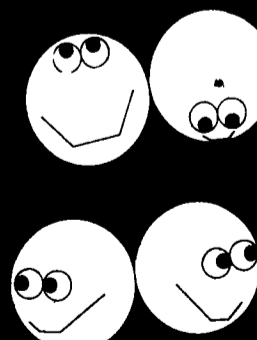
