Three Lebanon County youth with outstanding 4-H records have been named Keystone winners in three categories of the National 4-H Awards Program.

Named were Teresa Hill (Baker Scholarship); Ralph Major (Foods and Nutrition); and Steve Wagner (Bicycle).

The show will also feature a Palamino horse division on Saturday, May 12, sponsored by the Palamino Horse Association.



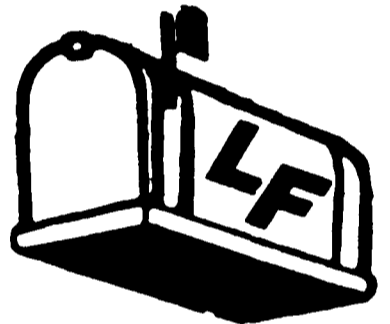
