RAIN DELAYED HARVESTS IN SOME WHEAT PRODUCING AREAS AND FEARS OF FREEZE IN SOUTHERN PLAINS ALSO SUPPORTED WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES SHARPLY HIGHER, STRENGTHENED BY HIGHER TRENDS IN OTHER GRAINS. SOYBEAN PRICES SHARPLY ADVANCED ALSO BOOSTED BY SOYBEAN STRENGTH.

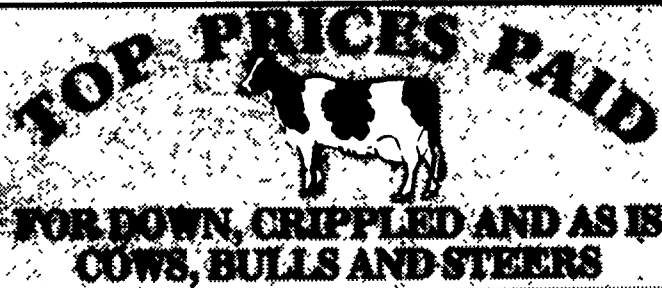

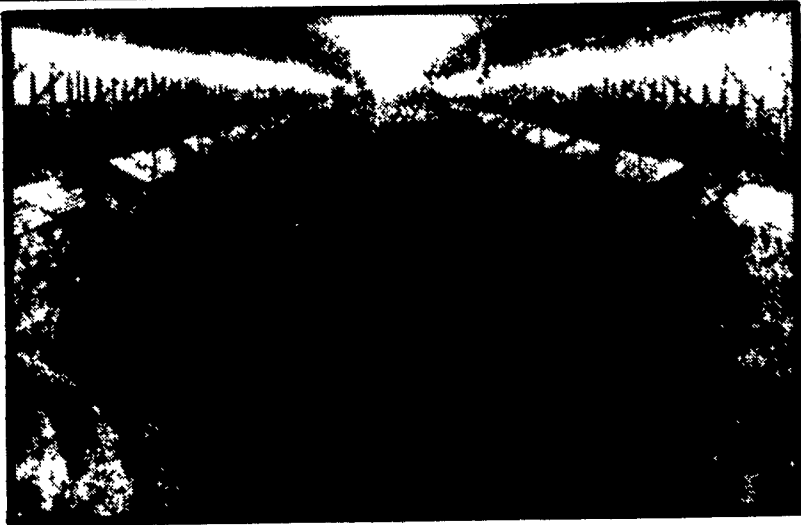

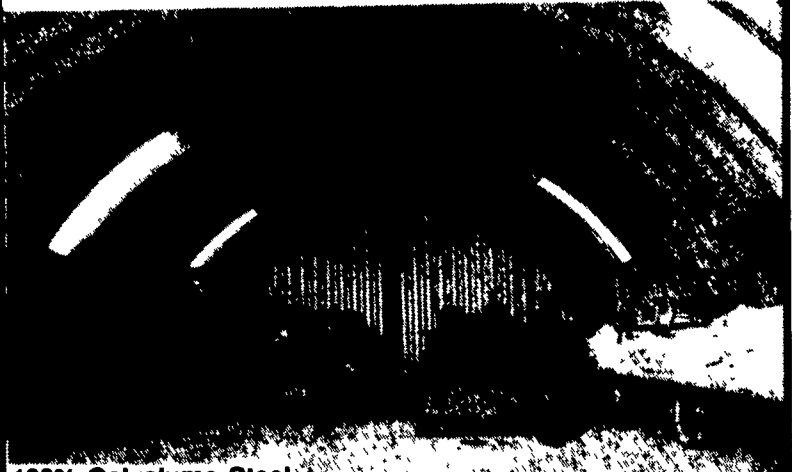
