

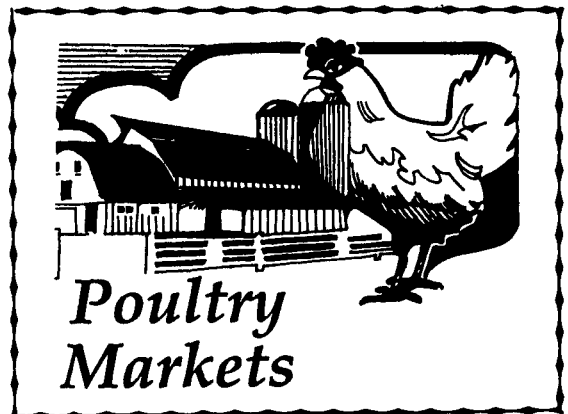

Movement of ready to cook whole fryers was fair. Supplies were somewhat irregular today and ranged tight to balanced. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged to higher at 61-69 cents.

Live supplies were adequate. Average live weights were desirable. Processing schedules were heavy. The trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, supplies of whole breasts were at least adequate, all other items were in close balance with trade needs.
