FEEDER CATTLE FLESH REMAINS EXTREMELY ATTRACTIVE TO BUYERS FOR MONTH OF MAY WITH MAJORITY OF CATTLE IN SLIGHTLY THIN TO SLIGHTLY FLESHY CONDITION.

BOTH FEEDER CATTLE BUYERS AND STOCKER BUYERS WERE AGGRESSIVE FOR NUMBERS. PRESENT PRICE LEVEL OF 700-800 LB. FEEDER CATTLE IS NEARLY EQUAL TO THE RECORD LEVEL IN THE SPRING OF 1979. HOWEVER DOLLARS ARE WORTH A LOT LESS NOW AND THE CHANCE OF THESE FEEDERS MAKING A LITTLE MONEY IS MANY TIMES GREATER THAN THE CHANCES OF THE SAME FEEDERS IN 1979.
