PROFIT TAKING AND GOOD HARVEST WEATHER WEIGHED ON PRICES WHEAT HARVEST MOVING INTO NORTH TEXAS AND NORTH OKLA-HOMA. DESPITE FAIR EXPORT DEMAND, CORN PRICES FELL. DRY WEATHER ALLOWED FARMERS INTO FIELDS WHERE CATCH-UP PLANTING PROCEEDS. SOYBEAN PLANTING PROGRESSING, DESPITE RECENT RAIN DELAYS. EXPORT

DEMAND LIGHT.

UNITED STATES...RAIN AND WET FIELD CONDITIONS CONTINUED TO SLOW ROW CROP PLANTINGS IN THE CORN BELT AND PORTIONS OF THE DELTA. SOIL MOISTURE WAS SURPLUS OR SURPLUS TO ADEQU-ATE IN IOWA, ILLINOIS, INDIANA, MISSOURI, ARKANSAS, AND KEN-TUCKY, SOIL MOISTURE WAS SHORT TO ADEQUATE IN NORTH-ERN GREAT PLAINS AND MOSTLY ADEQUATE IN THE CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN GREAT PLAINS. RAIN IMPROVED SMALL GRAIN AND PAS-TURE CONDITIONS IN THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST, BUT ADDITIONAL MOISTURE WAS NEEDED. SOIL MOISTURE WAS ADEQUATE IN THE EAST EXCEPT IN GEORGIA AND SOUTH CAROLINA, WHERE RAIN NEEDED. USSR...UNSEASONABLY COLD WEATHER SLOWS CROP GROWTH IN WESTERN USSR. SHOWERS BENE-FIT SPRING CROP PLANTINGS IN THE EASTERN NEW LANDS. EUR-OPE...RAIN BENEFITS WINTER AND SUMMER CROPS FROM THE SOUTH-WEST TO THE NORTHEAST. UNFA-VORABLE DRYNESS CONTINUES IN ENGLAND. SOUTH ASIA...RAIN IMPROVES PLANTING CONDITIONS OVER SOUTHERN INDIA. EASTERN ASIA...WIDESPREAD RAIN FAVORS SPRING PLANTED CROPS IN THE YANGTZE VALLEY AND MANCHUR IA. DRYNESS RETURNS TO THE NORTH CHINA PLAIN. SOUTHEAST ASIA...WIDESPREAD, LOCALLY HEAVY RAIN COVERS THAILAND AND THE PHILIPPINES, CAUSING SOME LOCAL FLOODING.
