The trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, supplies of wings were close, cutlets were adequate, whole breasts were somewhat irregular but mostly adequate, and dark meat items were at least adequate but improved buyer interest for next week deliveries were noted.

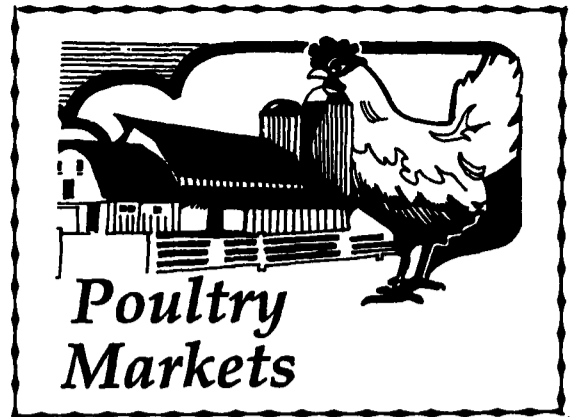
