USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN MARKET SUMMARY GRAIN PRICES MIXED, MOSTLY HIGHER WEDNESDAY. WHEAT PRICES MIXED, HARD RED WINTER PRICES LOWER IN KANSAS CITY, AS WINTER WHEAT HARVEST COMPLETE IN TEXAS AND OVER HALF COMPLETE IN OKLAHOMA. HOWEVER, REPORTED CROP DAMAGE IN SOFT RED WHEAT BELT BOOSTED PRICES. CHINA'S RECENT PURCHASE ALSO SUPPORTED SOFT WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES FELL, PRESSURED BY LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND. CONCERNS OVER CROP DAMAGE FROM RECENT HEAVY RAINS, FAILED TO BOOST CORN PRICES. CONCERNS THAT SOYBEAN CROPS SUFFERED DAMAGE AFTER SEVERE STORMS RECENTLY SWEEP ACROSS THE MIDWEST, PUSHED PRICES MODERATELY HIGHER. ALSO, REPORTS THAT JAPAN WILL PURCHASE U.S. SOYBEANS INSTEAD OF BRAZILIAN BEANS, GAVE MARKET SUPPORT. EXPORT NEWS: CHINA BOUGHT 359,800 METRIC TONS OF SOFT RED WINTER WHEAT FOR OCTOBER SHIPMENT UNDER EXPORT BONUS PROGRAM.
