Movement of ready to cook whole fryers was fairly good today. Supplies of lighter weight fryers were about adequate while 3 pound and over sizes were in close balance. Less than trucklot asking prices were higher at 59-71 cents. Live supplies were adequate. Average live weights ranged light to desirable. Processing schedules were heavy. The trade sentiment was at least steady. In the parts complex, supplies of all the dark meat items were in close balance to tight, wings were adequate, cutlets were irregular but generally adequate, and whole breasts ranged adequate to ample with some competitive pricing noted to clear stocks.

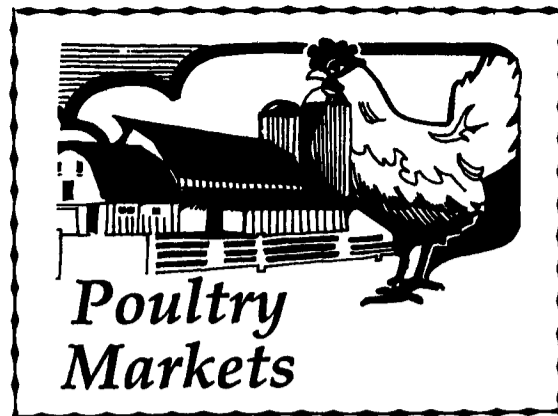

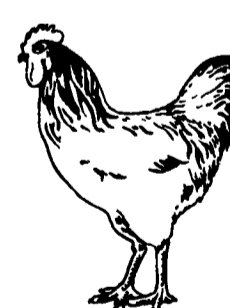
