Movement of ready to cook whole fryers was very good with most sellers delivering additional product today in anticipation of

closing for the holiday. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 60-72 cents. Live supplies were adequate with average weights on the light side of desirable. Processing schedules were heavy. The trade sentiment was mostly fully steady. In the parts complex, supplies of dark meat items were short of immediate needs, wings were in close balance, and breast items were at least adequate but sellers noted additional buyer inquiries for next week needs.
