GRAIN PRICES LOWER WEDNESDAY HARVEST PRESSURE AND LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND MAIN FACTORS FOR WHEAT DECLINES WINTER WHEAT HARVEST AROUND 75 PERCENT COMPLETE. KANSAS FINISHED AND NEBRASKA AND COLORADO OVER THE HALFWAY POINT. MISSOURI IS 77 PERCENT FINISHED VERSUS 94 PERCENT NOR-MALLY. DEMAND FOR FEED WHEAT CONTINUES VERY STRONG WHILE EXPORT PROSPECTS ARE LIMITED SPRING WHEAT CONDITIONS DECLINED SLIGHTLY, MAINLY IN MONTANA, WHERE CROP SIZE SLIGHTLY DOWN SINCE JULY 1ST HOWEVER, SUBSTANTIAL DEMAND IS NEEDED TO OFFSET THE LARGE SIZE OF THIS YEARS CROP RAINS ACROSS THE MIDWEST OVERNIGHT AND FORECAST FO. CONTINUED GOOD GROWING CONDITIONS PRESSURED CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES LOWER AS DID LIGHT
