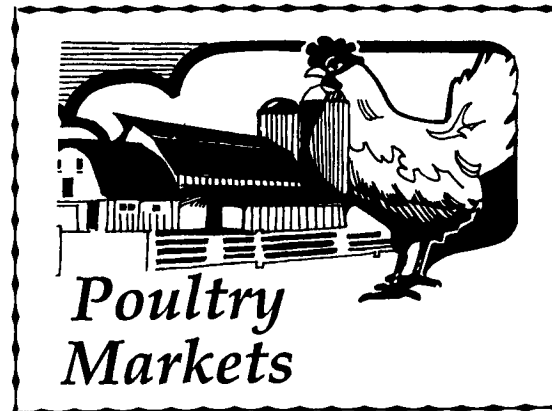

Live supplies were barely adequate with average live weights on the light side. Processor schedules were heavy. The trade sentiment was steady to instances fully steady. In the parts complex, supplies of wings were tight, legs, leg quarters, and whole breasts were in close balance to short, and cutlets were about adequate.
