mals and provide reasons, thereby allowing each of the students a chance to compare notes and assimilate new terminology.

Knight rearranged the order of the four cows, making Day's first choice second, and Day's second choice first.

The main reason was the legs of the animals. Knight's choice had bigger boned, stronger looking legs.

But after providing all his reasons for the placing, from spring of rib to depth of chest and overall balance . . . Day questioned the ranking.

No one else in the school had done so during the two day school.

And Day's trouble with Knight's selection was based on how the top two cows walked and carried themselves — Day claimed the number two cow sat back too far when she walked.

He requested that the two cows be made to walk again. And so they were. And Knight conceeded that Day's point was valid, that he hadn't seen the difference in walk. But he added that the thinnerlegged cow, that apparently walked better, would probably not last as long for the farmer — that the stronger-legged cow would be the better choice.

But there was nothing but admiration for Day in having the confidence to speak out and make a decision. That was what they were all there to get better at doing.
