USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN MARKET SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES TURNED HIGHER WEDNESDAY ON IMPROVED EXPORT DEMAND. CORN PRICES SLIGHTLY LOWER AS EXPORT ORDERS CONTINUE LIGHT. WHEAT AND CORN HAVE BECOME VERY COMPETITIVE IN PRICE FOR FEED GRAINS. LACK OF EXPORT DEMAND FOR EITHER HAS PUSHED MORE OF EACH INTO FEED MARKET. SOYBEANS BOUNCED AFTER SEVERE LOSSES AND OVERSOLD MARKET CONDITIONS.

UNITED STATES...RAIN SLOWED WINTER WHEAT HARVEST IN THE CORN BELT. WINTER WHEAT HARVEST WAS VIRTUALLY COMPLETE IN THE CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN GREAT PLAINS AND UNDERWAY IN MOST OF THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST. USSR...IN WESTERN USSR, SOAKING RAIN OVER NORTH-EASTERN AREAS BENEFITS WINTER AND SPRING GRAINS IN THE FILLING STAGE. DRY WEATHER IN THE SOUTH HELPS THE WINTER GRAIN HARVEST. IN THE NEW LANDS, WIDESPREAD SIGNIFICANT RAINS COVERS SOUTHERN CROP AREAS, IMPROVING CONDITIONS FOR SPRING GRAINS IN THE FILLING STAGE. EUROPE...DRYNESS IN THE SOUTH BENEFITS WINTER GRAINS HARVEST BUT CONTINUES TO STRESS UNIRRIGATED SUMMER CROPS. SOUTH ASIA...BENEFICIAL RAIN COVERS PORTIONS OF THE SOUTHERN INTERIOR. HEAVY RAIN AND FLOODING CONTINUE IN THE EAST. EASTERN ASIA...TROPICAL STORM ROBYN BRINGS HEAVY RAIN AND FLOODING TO SECTIONS OF TAIWAN, ZHEJIANG, AND THE KOREAN PENINSULA. UNSEASONABLE HEAT AND DRYNESS COVER THE CENTRAL YANGTZE VALLEY. SOUTHEAST ASIA...A DRYING TREND CONTINUED OVER THAILAND'S PRIMARY CORN REGION. BENEFICIAL SHOWERS COVER THE PHILIPPINES. SOUTH AMERICA...BENEFICIAL SHOWERS HELP WHEAT PLANTING IN ARGENTINA. DRIER WEATHER BENEFITS WHEAT IN SOUTHERN BRAZIL. AUSTRALI-

A...WIDESPREAD HEAVY RAIN RETURNS TO WESTERN AUSTRALIA. LIGHT TO MODERATE RAIN CONTINUES ACROSS SOUTH AUSTRALIA AND VICTORIA. CANADA...DRIER WEATHER FAVORS GROWTH OF VEGETATIVE TO HEADING WHEAT. RAIN IS NEEDED, HOWEVER, IN THE SOUTHWEST FOLLOWING ANOTHER WEEK OF DRY, WARM WEATHER.
