Movement of ready to cook whole fryers was very light today. Supplies were somewhat irregular but adequate overall. Less than trucklot asking prices were lower at 53-68 cents. Live supplies were barely adequate to short. Average live weights ranged light to desirable. Processing schedules today were also light. The trade sentiment continued unsettled. In the parts complex, supplies of leg quarters were short of filling buyer demand, wings were barely adequate, cutlets and whole breasts were generally adequate and clearing but some buyers were accepting product for immediate needs only, and legs were irregularly distributed and ranged fully adequate to burdensome.

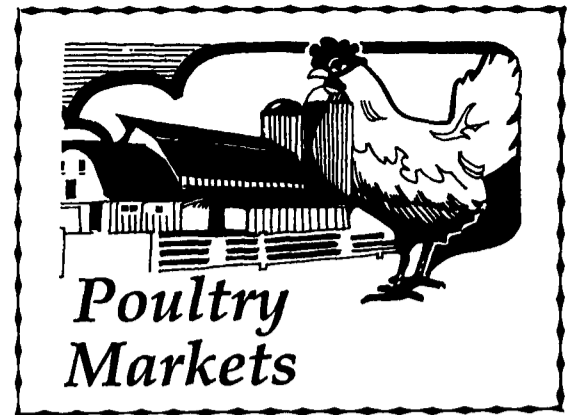
