Movement of ready to cook whole fryers was fairly good for a Wednesday. Supplies were in good balance on the 3 pound and lighter sizes, close on the heavier sizes. Less than trucklot asking prices were steady at 50-64 cents. Live supplies were adequate. Average live weights were lighter than desired but were improving. Processing schedules today were light. The trade sentiment was generally steady. In the parts complex, supplies of breast items were at least adequate, dark meat items were in close balance at most shipping points with some buyer inquiries for late week needs not filled, and wings were irregularly distributed and ranged close to fully adequate.

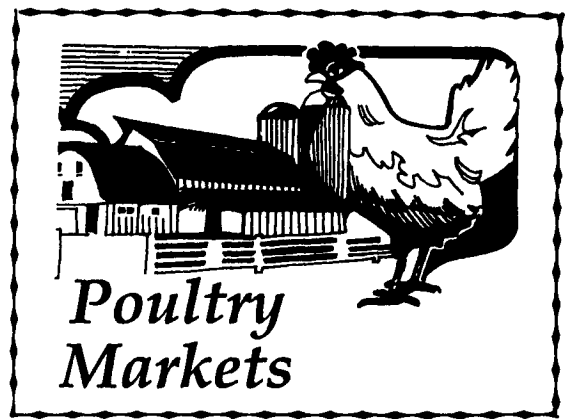

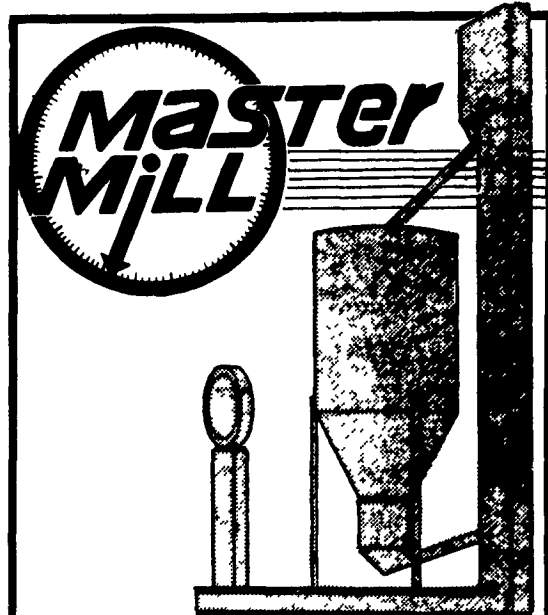
