mers currently need a water obstruction and encroachment permit, which entails a minimum 45-day review.

Individuals would still need to submit written notice to DER if these regulations go into effect. However, farmers would no longer have to pay a \$50 application fee and complete a 5-page appli-

"The new system will greatly minimize the loss of time in securing appropriate approvals," said Shambaugh. "Farmers will appreciate the state's efforts to cut back the amount of paperwork involved in building crossings to accommodate their livestock or machin-


Farm Credit Re-Elects Jackson, Kinsey
