More importantly, the proposed regulations would give farmers an additional boost toward improving conservation practices on their farms, said Shambaugh.

The Pennsylvania State Grange, which represents about 40,000 rural and farming Pennsylvanians, wholly supports the state Department of Environmental Resources' proposed changes to the permitting process for property owners who plan to install, operate, and maintain agricultural crossings and ramps in regulated waters.

The proposal would only require farmers obtain a general permit that would take less time to receive and not require a fee. Farmers

currently need a water obstruction and encroachment permit, which entails a minimum 45-day review.

Individuals would still need to submit written notice to DER if these regulations go into effect. However, farmers would no longer have to pay a \$50 application fee and complete a 5-page application.

These new regulations should be completed by the end of the year.

"The new system will greatly minimize the loss of time in securing appropriate approvals," said Shambaugh. "Farmers will appreciate the state's efforts to cut back the amount of paperwork involved in building crossings to accommodate their livestock or machinery."
