

# 223 Entries At 23rd Central District 4-H Dairy Show

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.)  
— In 4-H district-level dairy competitions here, a number of youth from seven south central Pennsylvania counties on Monday secured positions for their animals in the upcoming state show.

Officials said 223 animals representing six dairy breeds were

shown in the Small Arena of the State Farm Show complex, during the 23rd South Central District 4-H Dairy Show.

Those whose animal was presented a blue ribbon are now qualified to show that animal in the state 4-H dairy show. The state show is to be held Sept. 24 in the Large Arena of the complex.

In order to get to the district

competitions, youth first showed their animals on a county level.

Judges present blue ribbons based on the quality of the animal and not its placing among other animals presented for competition.

Despite sweltering heat, the six-

hour type judging went mostly without incident. Terry Rawn, from Charleston, W.Va., judged Holsteins, Guernseys and Ayrshires. Amos Rudderow, from Massey, Md., judged Jerseys and Brown Swiss and Milking Shorthorn.

In competition among herds representing the counties, Lancaster and Lebanon youth placed high in Brown Swiss and Holsteins. Lebanon County had the only herd

offered for the Ayrshire breed and Cumberland County offered the lone herd among Milking Shorthorns.

Cumberland County had the top Jersey herd, over Franklin County animals present. York County's Guernseys bested Lancaster's.
