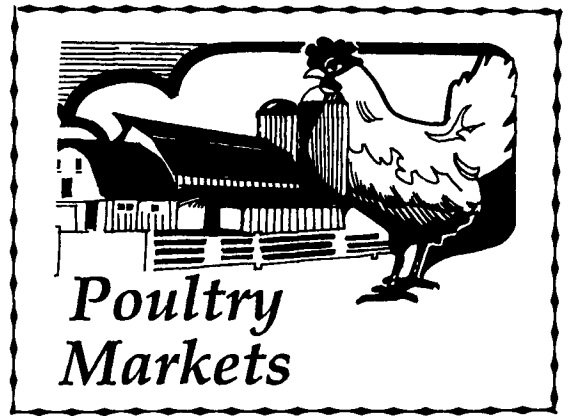

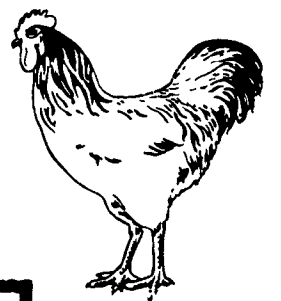

In the parts complex, supplies of cutlets and whole breasts were no more than adequate, dark meat items were adequate, and wings were in close balance with buyer needs.
