Lebanon Agriculture Services Take New Residence

 LEBANON (Lebanon Co.) —
 Starting Monday agricultural services in Lebanon County will never be the same.

All agricultural services are to be relocating from their current widespread offices to a central Lebanon Valley Agricultural Center, located at the county fair grounds.

The five agencies to move into the one building are the USDA Farmers Home Administration (FHA), the county extension office, the USDA Soil Conservation Service (SCS), the Lebanon County Conservation District, and the USDA Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS).

Of those offices, the SCS office will be closed for business Monday to make the move. The conservation district is to be closed both Monday and Tuesday. The ASCS office will be closed Tuesday. The extension office is to be closed Thursday.

Except for the extension office,

all telephone numbers will remain the same. The new number for the extension service will be 270-4391.

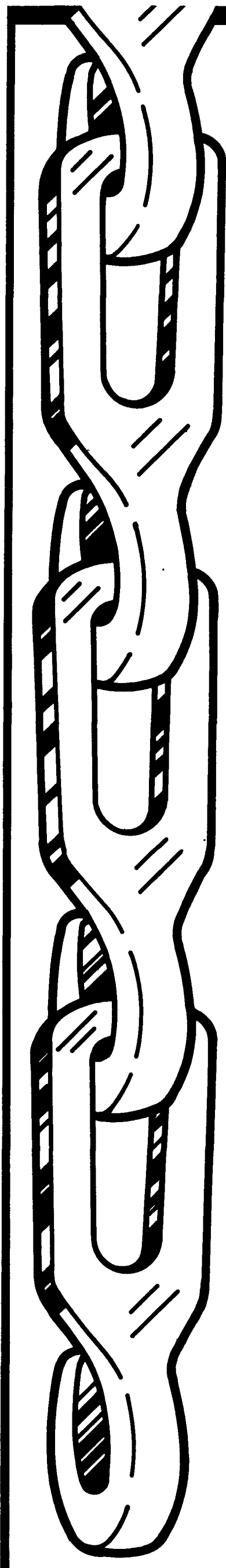
The move culminates several years of work from various agencies and levels of government to bring the various service agencies under one roof. For a number of years the various offices have been located miles apart.

Early this year, the Lebanon Valley Exposition Corporation, after purchasing additional acreage to the Lebanon Fairgrounds, broke ground on the site announcing the start of construction.

According to officials, construction is on schedule.

The change of location will temporarily restrict some of the services available to residents. However, officials say they expect the all offices to be running will equal efficiency and promptness within several weeks.

An open house of the extension facility is tentatively scheduled for early spring, according to Kenneth Winebark, county agent.
