Jonsumers are shifting from the purchase of whole chicken to more cut-up broilers and parts, according to the National Broiler Council. Only about 30 percent of broilers in retail grocery stores are now sold as "whole chickens". In 1988, less than 60 percent of chicken was purchased cut-up or in parts. This compares to almost 70 percent in 1990.
