PROFIT TAKING AND FORECAST OF CLEARING WEATHER WITH "LOTS OF FALL HARVESTING TO DO" HALTED ADVANCING WHEAT AND SOYBEAN PRICES WEDNESDAY BUT CORN AND SOYBEANS DODGED THE BULLET. WHEAT 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER; CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS HIGHER; SORGHUM 2 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER; SOYBEANS 7 TO 9 CENTS LOWER. EXPORT ORDERS PUT SOME LIFE IN THE SOYA COMPLEX PAST FEW DAYS BUT PROFIT TAKING SET IN WEDNESDAY. ORDERS FOR BOTH SOYBEANS AND SOYBEAN MEAL. CORN EXPORT SHOWED UP WEDNESDAY. RAINS PUT HARVEST OF CORN AND SOYBEANS ON HOLD. MILO HARVEST NOT YET IN FULL SWING. FROST LAST NIGHT AND TONIGHT WILL HURT SOME LATE BEANS, ESPECIALLY WHEAT BEANS BUT THIS NOT EXPECTED TO BE A BIG PRICE MOVING FACTOR. FROST WILL SPEED UP DEFOLIATING, MATURING AND DRYING OF CORN AND BEANS TO GET THE COMBINES ROLLING WITH SUNSHINE. SEASONAL LATE HARVEST THIS YEAR. RAINS BENEFICIAL TO NEWLY SEEDED WINTER WHEAT. INDUSTRY KEEPING ONE EYE PEELED FOR THURSDAY'S CROP PRODUCTION REPORT.
