

Judge Selects Virginia Fair Angus Champs

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. — Angus exhibitors from throughout the United States brought cattle to compete for championship honors at the 1990 State Fair of Virginia Angus Show in Richmond. Dee Woody of Carbondale, Illinois, evaluated the 88 entries in the heifer, bull, and cow-calf pair categories.

Northcote Queen Sonja was selected the grand champion heifer after winning the junior championship. She was an April 1985 daughter of Waldeck Shocker and was owned by Northcote Farm & Elk Creek Angus, both of Forest, Virginia.

Kruegers Bellona walked away the reserve grand champion heifer. Owned by Whitney Dalton, Altavista, the heifer first won the intermediate division and was a May 1989 daughter of Grubbs Mac Kenzie.

The grand champion bull was WK Classified owned by Yadkin River Angus Farm, Clemmons, North Carolina, and Whitestone & Krebs, Gordon, Nebraska. The bull was first selected the junior champion and was a February 1989 son of Brost Power Drive.

The reserve grand champion bull was an October 1989 son of B&L Stitch named White Hall Superman ES6. Danwell Farms, Earlysville, led out the reserve grand entry. The bull was first picked as judge Woody's senior

champion.

In other heifer competition, Genito ACF Sunshine Gal won the senior championship for owner Andrew Federspiel of Powhatan.

The reserve junior champion entry was K W Coral 9100. The heifer is owned by Bradley Watts, Bowling Green, Kentucky; Goshen Farm, Paris, Kentucky; and W.P. Watts, Hiseville, Kentucky.

Andrew Aitcheson, Waynesboro, owned the reserve intermediate champion heifer named B H Lass 349C.

Northcote Norita won the senior heifer calf championship for Northcote Farm. The reserve senior heifer calf champion was Whitestone Kinannie 960, exhibited by Yadkin River Angus Farm.

B H Miss Canada Charlie E9C won the junior heifer calf championship for owner Andrew Aitcheson. The reserve junior heifer calf winner was J P Karamo 8100 owned by Evie and John Pyne Jr. of Culpeper.

In other bull competition, Byrnely Lone rider 7158 was named reserve senior champion. John Hausner, The Plains, exhibited the reserve winner.

Entre 29 won the reserve junior championship for Andrew Aitcheson and Carroll Grove, both of Waynesboro.

Manx O Mac Henry walked away the intermediate champion bull. He is owned by Manx Farms of Newark, Ohio. The reserve intermediate winner was Zeuswyn Mac Bo 039 owned by Carlton Clore and William Graves, both of Culpeper.

Byrnley of The Plains owned the senior bull calf winner, Byrnley Valentino 2249. The reserve senior bull calf champion was G F Kosar owned by Goshen Farm.

W R B Prime Time 180 won the junior bull calf championship. The winner is owned by Roger Bowles, Kents Store. The reserve junior bull calf winner was Northcote Primus. He is owned by Northcote Farm.
