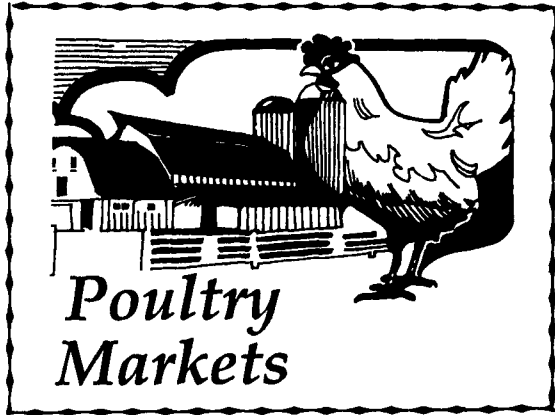

Prices generally trended lower as increasingly competitive pricing for the limited buyer interest forced values down. In turn breakers bid lower for available offerings of raw materials. Schedules were often adjusted in line with needs. Floor stocks were usually sufficient to handle current trade needs.

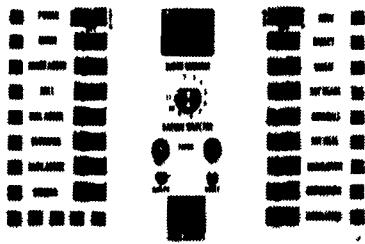
