THE CRUX IS EXPORT ORDERS AS EVIDENT BY TUESDAY'S YEAR TO DATE GRAIN INSPECTED FOR EXPORT REPORT. VERY GOOD 1990 U.S. CROPS AND ESTIMATED PRODUCTION. NICE WEATHFR AND HARVEST GRIND-ING TO A HALT. WORLD GRAIN SUP-PLIES INCREASED. GLOBAL ECONOMICS, POLICIES AND POLITICS NOT ENTICING U S FOREIGN SALES. LACK OF GOOD NEWS AND FUTURES PRICES SINKING. ELELVA-**TORS AND DEALERS MOVING BASIS** HIGHER BUT UNABLE TO MATCH DECLINES ON THE BOARD TO DROP CASH PRICES. NEW SEEDED WINTER WHEAT CROP LOOKING GOOD.


