USDA DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN MARKET SUMMARY. GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES HIT HARD THIS WEEK. SLEDGE HAMMER BLOW WEDNESDAY WITH WHEAT 4 TO 6 CENTS LOWER, CORN 4 TO 6 CENTS LOWER, GRAIN SORGHUM 6 TO 10 CENTS LOWER AND SOYBEANS 5 TO 9 CENTS LOWER. THE CRUX IS EXPORT ORDERS AS EVIDENT BY TUESDAY'S YEAR TO DATE GRAIN INSPECTED FOR EXPORT REPORT. VERY GOOD 1990 U.S. CROPS AND ESTIMATED PRODUCTION. NICE WEATHER AND HARVEST GRINDING TO A HALT. WORLD GRAIN SUPPLIES INCREASED. GLOBAL ECONOMICS, POLICIES AND POLITICS NOT ENTICING U.S. FOREIGN SALES. LACK OF GOOD NEWS AND FUTURES PRICES SINKING. ELEVATORS AND DEALERS MOVING BASIS HIGHER BUT UNABLE TO MATCH DECLINES ON THE BOARD TO DROP CASH PRICES. NEW SEEDED WINTER WHEAT CROP LOOKING GOOD.

NORTHEAST BROILER/FRYER PARTS: PART 1 OF 2. FEDERAL-STATE: Trucklot buying interest was seasonally light and selective. Demand and supplies of skinless boneless breasts varied as did trading prices. While some dealers noted higher prices others noted availability and trading at unchanged levels. Whole breasts were in close balance and confidently held; however, most buyers were cautious and little movement was noted beyond standing commitments. Legs were more than adequate and leg quarters were readily available and slow in clearing. Thighs and drumsticks were fully adequate with thighs in the closer balance. Wings were fully steady at current prices. Gizzards remained seasonally strong.




