Movement of ready-to-cook whole fryers was mostly light but expected to improve at weeks end for next week's deliveries. Supplies were at least adequate for current demand. Less than trucklot asking prices remained unchanged at 42-58 cents. Live supplies were moderate. Average live weights were desirable to instances heavy. Processing schedules were moderately heavy. Trade sentiment was mostly steady. In the parts complex, breasts were sluggish while the call for dark meat improved. Wings were in a strong position.

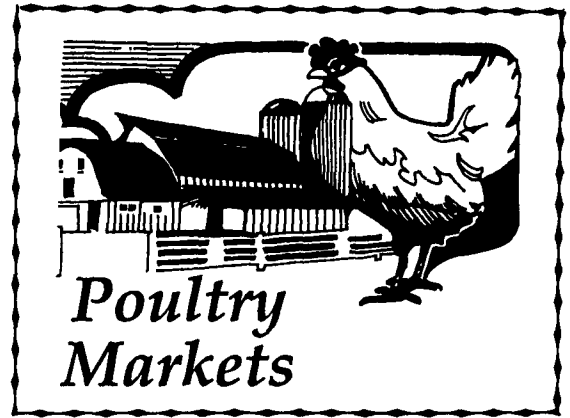

National Egg Market

Nov. 20, 1990

Prices were unchanged. The market tone was steady. Demand was fair to very good, mostly good and best into carton channels. Inter-dealer demand focused on graded eggs due to limited grading schedules. Floor stocks of graded eggs were barely adequate to adequate, and closely monitored. Ungraded egg supplies were generally adequate. Breakers provided a light to good demand for shell eggs, mostly light due to shortened Thanksgiving breaking schedules.

New York Eggs

Nov. 20, 1990

Prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was steady. Demand was generally good as influenced by Thanksgiving and shortened delivery schedules. Supplies were usually adequate, but fill-in volumes of graded eggs were difficult to secure. The New Jersey inventory was 6% below last Monday's level, and the New York inventory was 20% above last week.
