De la Garza stressed that the House Agriculture Committee is keeping a close eye on the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) talks. "We didn't go through the pain and agony of writing the Farm Bill to give it all away overseas." He will be part of a Congressional delegation going to Brussels this week to observe the concluding sessions of the trade negotiations.

He addressed the importance of unity and cooperation. He said it is vital for the various segments of agriculture to work together for mutual benefit and support one another in legislative efforts.
