In the parts complex, supplies of wings were tight, whole breasts were adequate to fully adequate, dark meat was adequate, and skinless boneless breasts were irregularly distributed but at least adequate and slow to clear for some shippers.

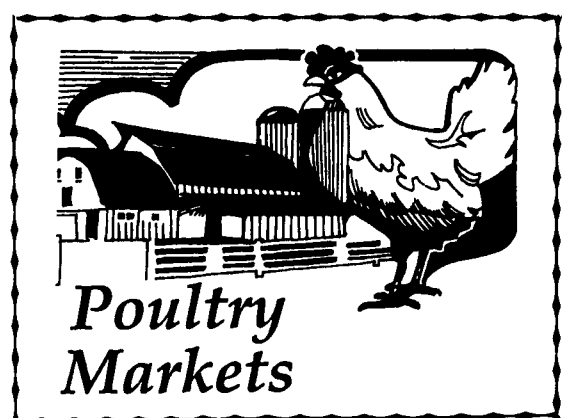
