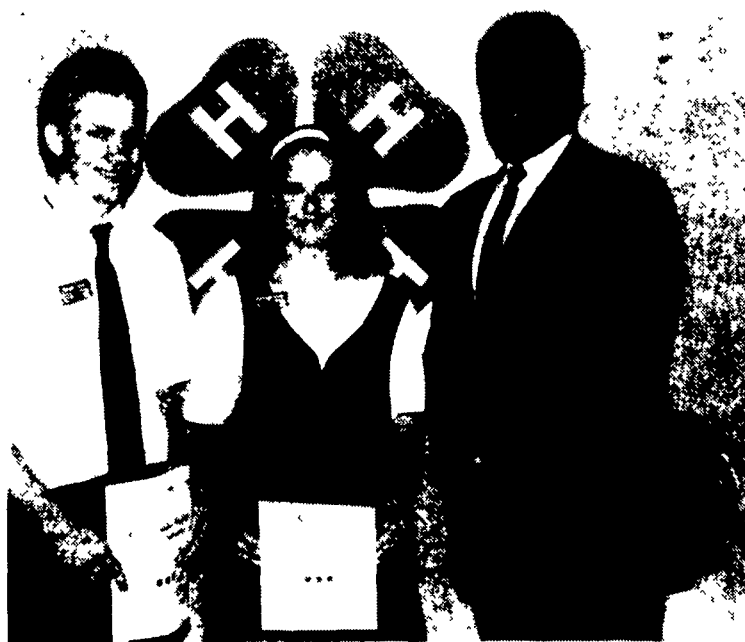


Montgomery Co. Recognizes 4-H Volunteers

CREAMERY (Montgomery Co.) — Montgomery County 4-H members, parents and extension staff applauded the accomplishments of their 4-H volunteer leaders and outstanding 4-H members at the county-wide achievement night held recently at the 4-H Center in Creamery.

Every adult leader received an achievement certificate recognizing the number of years of service, while those with five, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, or 35 years received additional recognition with a 4-H pin. Teenage volunteers also received recognition.

A special award, "Leader of the Year" for 1990, was presented to Sara Danchower of Lansdale, a leader of the Lansdale Lassies 4-H Club, for her outstanding leadership and dedication to not only her own club, but to the community and to the overall Montgomery County 4-H Program. Her enthu-

siasm and willingness to share ideas to bring about change over the past 41 years that she has been a leader earned her the title. Lynda Ayres of Collegeville also received special recognition as "Outstanding New Leader," awarded to a leader with less than four years of service. Lynda is a leader of the Trappe 4-H Community Club. Commissioner Rita C. Banning presented the awards to these two top leaders.

Several outstanding teens received recognition for their teen leadership role in their local club as well as the county, regional, and state 4-H Programs. The following teens received the highest

A new recognition program to highlight a younger or newer 4-H member who has shown an outstanding positive attitude, willingness to help others, enthusiasm and acceptance of responsibility is the Spirit of 4-H Award. Truehart (Norristown), Shawn Mentzer (Royersford) and Katie Kelly (Harleysville).

Each year 4-H acknowledges individuals or businesses in the community who have contributed in a special way to the 4-H program. 


