USSR NEW CREDIT PACKAGE, MIDEAST SITUATION AND MAJOR USDA REPORTS TO BE RELEASED FRIDAY ALL FACTORS IN MIXED MARKET TRENDS WEDNESDAY WHEAT CLOSED ON BOTH SIDES UNCHANGED CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER SORGHUM MIXED SOYBEANS 2 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES ADVANCED ON REPORT, USSR TO PURCHASE LARGER AMOUNT THAN EXPECTED IN NEW CREDIT AGREEMENT IDEAS THAT RECENT LOWS WERE OVERDONE STRENGTHENED WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES SLIGHTLY LOWER DESPITE LARGE PURCHASE FROM USSR. HOWEVER, MAJORITY OF EXPORT ACTIVITY REMAINS SLOW SOYBEAN PRICES MADE SUBSTANTIAL GAINS AS SOVIETS PURCHASE LARGE AMOUNT OF MEAL AND SHORT COVERINGS TAKEN ON THE BOARD BOOSTED PRICES
