Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, supplies of wings and boneless skinless breasts were adequate to fully adequate. Legs, leg quarters and whole breasts were adequate.

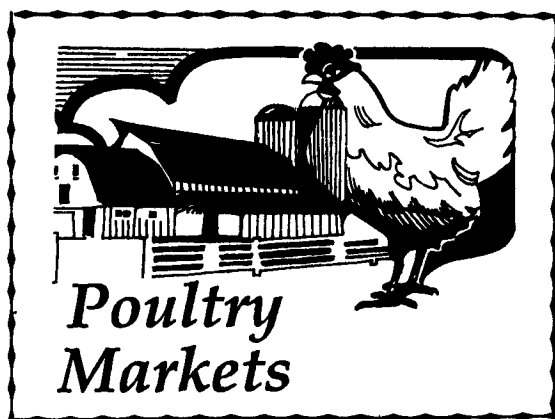

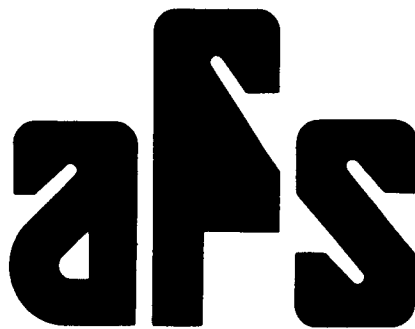
