

Lebanon 4-H Livestock Club Holds Banquet

PRESCOTT (Lebanon Co.) — The Lebanon County 4-H Livestock Club held its annual recognition banquet Tuesday night at Prescott Fire Hall.

The annual banquet is held to recognize the achievements of the youth who participate in the county 4-H program and to name outstanding members.

Receiving the outstanding senior member award was Daryl Bomgardner who showed the 1991 Farm Show grand champion market swine and numerous other top swine at shows at Timonium, Md., the county fair, roundup, at KILE, and the Ohio State Fair.

Bomgardner, 17, is the son of Charlie and Marlene Bomgardner and has also participated in judging contests with PSU during state days, and in Lancaster and York counties. He attended an oral reasons workshop, and also entered in the stockmen's competition at KILE.

He said his extracurricular activities include being a member of his FFA parliamentary procedure team, high school basketball, track, Honor Society, and involvement with his church youthgroup, softball and volleyball teams and the Leaders Corps.

During the banquet, Bomgardner presented a picture of his Farm Show champion hog to Carlos R. Leffler, who had purchased the animal for a record price and then donated it back to Bomgardner so that the youth could continue to use it in his breeding program.

Receiving an outstanding junior member award was Jon Harnish, 12, son of Guy and Carol Harnish. John was involved with beef and swine projects and participated in KILE; the state Farm Show; county, regional and state judging contests; the York Fair; was a member of the Pork Bowl team; and took first place in the age group at the county fair and roundup for swine and took second place in his age group for beef production.

In addition to 4-H involvement, Harnish has participated in the Youth to Youth Feeder Pig Sale; the Berks County-Southeast District Cattleman's Association; the Pennsylvania Jr. Limousin Association; and in various fund raising events.

Receiving an outstanding rookie member award was Katie Moyer, 10, daughter of Greg and Susan Moyer.

Moyer received a 100 on her project book and took first place in

blocking and a second in showmanship at the county fair. She also received a trophy as an honor 4-Her. Her projects included market lamb and blocking and showmanship.

She competed in the county fair, and participated in a sheep shearing school, barbecue ticket sales project, a lamb promotion at Fox's Market and helped with the clean-up force at the county fair.

In addition, Moyer is a cheerleader for Ebenezer Football Association, a member of her church choir, a violinist, is involved with church musicals and also is a member of another 4-H group.

Also during the banquet, special recognition was given to Hatfield Quality Meats for support of the club as a consistent buyer, packer bids, donations for pork promotions, financial support of the pork bowl, both local and state.

Kenneth Winebark, livestock extension agent in Lebanon County made recognition of the Friends of 4-H, and also gave recognition to those whose animals performed well at the state Farm Show, in special judging contests and to those who captured top places in county competitions during the past year.

Special recognition was made to the members of the county Pork Bowl team who had won high team overall in the state. The 1990 A team consisted of Danny Atkins, Jon Harnish, Amy Harnish and John Risser. The B team was made up of Brian Kreider, Roxanne Kirst, Jason Krall and Katie Lefever.

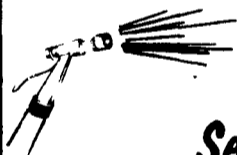

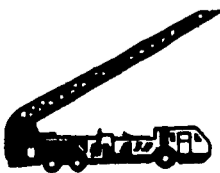
