LOUIS STEADY TO 1 CENT LOWER; CORN STEADY TO 3 CENTS HIGHER; SORGHUM STEADY TO 1 CENT HIGHER; SOYBEANS 5 TO 9 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT PRICES MIXED, WEAKNESS DUE TO OVERNIGHT RAINS IN CENTRAL PLAINS AREA. HOWEVER, IMPROVED EXPORT INTEREST ADDED SUPPORTED TO WHEAT PRICES. STRENGTH IN WHEAT PIT AND SHORT COVERINGS ON THE BOARD, MOVED CORN PRICES HIGHER. EXPORT SALES TO SOUTH KOREA FOR U.S. CORN SUPPORTED PRICES SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED TO DECLINE UNDER LACK OF EXPORT DEMAND.
