

Brown Swiss Association Recognizes Cows

BELOIT, Wis. — The national Brown Swiss Cattle Breeders' Association recently recognized production records for a number of its members' cows.

In Pennsylvania, three cows owned by Gary Lee Mase, Lebanon, recorded lactations worthy of national recognition.

Mases' Meadow Hill Performer Chrissy produced 25,320 pounds of milk in 305 days, freshening at 6 years, 9 months. The milk components included 1,036 pounds of fat and 865 pounds of protein.

Meadow Hill Prospect Lauren, on a lactation of more than 306 days, recorded 23,540 pounds of milk with 1,008 pounds of fat and 883 pounds of protein. She freshened at 6 years, 11 months.

Another cow owned by Mase was noted for both high fat and protein production levels. Quiet Valley Jim Dandy, freshening at 6 years, 3 months, produced 29,580 pounds of milk, 1,153 pounds of fat and 1,084 pounds of protein during a lactation of more than 306 days.

A cow owned by Richard Wenger, of Manheim, was also recognized for outstanding production.

Shady Creek Jackie Jan R Twin, was honored twice on a lactation that began with a freshening at 6 years, 4 months. Before 305 days, Twin produced 25,890 pounds of milk, 1,019 pounds of fat and 853 pounds of protein.

After the lactation continued, she recorded a production of 28,530 pounds of milk, 1,125 pounds of fat and 960 pounds of protein.

A cow owned by William Daubert, of Pine Grove, produced another special record for components. Wind Mill Distinction Elisa, on a lactation of more than 306 days, that began with a freshening at 5 years, 6 months, produced 24,860 pounds of milk, 1,028 pounds of fat and 910 pounds of protein.

Dean and Brenda Daubert, of McElhattan, related to William, also had one of their cows receive high component production distinction. Wind Mill Distinction Joana ET, on a lactation that began at 6 years, 7 months, produced 25,190 pounds of milk with 1,004 pounds of fat and 907 pounds of protein.

In Ohio, recognition went to two cows owned by the Earl Bursiek family, of Gibsonburg.

Twin Gate Queenies Rosie and Twin Gate Marthas Melody both made high records during lactations of more than 306 days. Rosie produced 26,510 pounds of milk starting at 10 years, 7 months, with 1,053 pounds of fat and 874 pounds of protein. Melody produced 24,280 pounds of milk, 1,007 pounds of fat and 849 pounds of protein on a lactation that began when she was 9 years,

11 months.

A cow owned by Garbro & Bry-Lyn Swiss, West Salem, Garbro Telstar Lisa, was recognized for producing 25,070 pounds of milk, 863 pounds of fat, and 901 pounds of protein in less than 306 days.

Johann Lovely Lamp ET, owned by Johann Acres, of St. Marys, was recognized for a production at 4 years, on a lactation less than 306 days, of 24,540 pounds of milk, 1,072 pounds fat and 826 pounds of protein.

LaRainbow Farms, New Knoxville, also had a cow worthy of recognition. La Rainbow Starfly, at 8 years, 4 months, produced 27,450 pounds milk, 1,166 pounds of fat and 888 pounds of protein in more than 306 days.

A cow owned by R-Hart Farm Wapakoneta, Ohio, had achieved honor roll status in that her production record fell within the top five all-time records within her age division.

High Spruce Stretchy Eve, on a lactation from a freshening at 8 years, 7 months, produced 31,780 pounds of milk, 1,668 pounds of fat and 1,037 pounds of protein. Her lactation exceeded 306 days.

Two cows owned by WarWick Farms, in Mt. Vernon, also were recognized for high lactation productions.

WarWick Farms Award 805, as a 2-year-old produced 19,010 pounds of milk with 651 pounds of

fat and 577 pounds of protein during a lactation of less than 306 days.

WarWick Farms Alpine Rosie, at 6y0m, produced 23,450 pounds of milk, 1,014 pounds of fat and 791 pounds of protein.

A Brown Swiss cow owned by William Watkins, of Belmont, was recognized. Fox Trail Tamara, at 9y4m, produced 24,750 pounds of milk, 1,048 pounds of fat and 885 pounds of protein on a lactation of more than 306 days.

Top Acres Elegant Fawn, owned by Robert and Mark Witmer, of Columbiana, at 8y6m, was recognized for a lactation of less than 306 days with 27,130 pounds milk, 1,058 fat, and 894 pounds of protein.

In Maryland, a cow owned by Dwayne Bell, of Knoxville, Le Fer Ban Stylish Mary, produced 26,810 pounds of milk, 1,186 pounds fat and 887 pounds of protein on a lactation in excess of 306 days. She freshened at 5 years.

In Virginia, a cow owned by Gary McDonald, Stephens City, was recognized twice for the same lactation that she started as a 4-year-old.

Shen-Val Target Miss Happy received honor roll recognition for her lactation production under 305 days. Within that time she produced 26,590 pounds of milk, 969 pounds fat, and 940 pounds of protein.

She also received further recognition when her lactation extended beyond 306 days to produce 26,940 pounds milk, 984 pounds fat and 958 pounds protein.

Another Virginia Brown Swiss

to receive recognition was Sand Rock Jolly Ponder, owned by Oak Spring Dairy, of Upperville. She produced 27,450 pounds of milk, 1,029 pounds of fat and 873 pounds of protein on a lactation of more than 306 days she started at 7 years, 11 months of age.

In New York five cows were recognized.

Vine Valley Peter Belinda, owned by Leon W. and Leon N. Button, of Rushville, showed a production of 24,140 pounds of milk, 1,002 pounds fat and 869 pounds protein on a lactation of more than 306 days. She freshened at 7 years, 1 month.

Gretna Acres Johnny D Sue, owned by Gretna Acres, Otego, showed a production of 23,450 pounds of milk, 1,072 pounds of fat and 866 pounds of protein on a lactation of more than 306 days. She freshened at 3 years, 7 months.

Ka Cy Nelda, owned by Ka-Cy Farms, of Medina, produced 23,510 pounds of milk, 1,094 pounds fat and 847 pounds protein on a lactation of more than 306 days. She freshened at 7 years, 5 months.

Sunny Acres Telstar Rinkles, owned by Lester Tyler, of Milford, was recognized twice during the same lactation that she started at 5 years, 7 months. She had produced 22,580 pounds of milk, 1,008 pounds of fat and 824 pounds of protein before 305 days. She finished with 23,680 pounds milk, 1,057 pounds fat and 874 pounds protein.

Another of Tyler's cows, Sunny Acres Philip Fake, freshened at 4 years, 9 months, produced 27,830 pounds of milk, 1,218 pounds of fat and 951 pounds of protein on a lactation of more than 306 days.
